The nature of these services means they are available 24/7 so please call them as soon as you can to get some support.

Employers should ask employees to confide in family members, to contact their doctor or a support service listed below and to stay in touch with them (the employer contact) to advise how you are going, what appointments are arranged and eventually when they plan to return to work, of course they may need to be reminded to provide a medical certificate for their absence.

Family and domestic violence can include, but is not limited to controlling behaviour, physical violence, sexual assault, emotional abuse, stalking, technology facilitated abuse, and financial abuse.
